Matt Bishop is a professor in the Department of Computer Science at the University of California in Davis, CA, and is a co-director of the Computer Security Laboratory.

He does research in computer security. Specific areas of interest include data sanitization, formal models of access controls, and especially vulnerabilities analysis, including the detection and remediation of security flaws. Of late, he has been studying integrity issues in electronic recordation, and security properties of e-voting.

He also teaches computer security, operating systems, programming, and for many years presented well-received tutorials at SANS, USENIX, and other conferences. His textbook, *Computer Security: Art and Science* (ISBN 0-201-44099-7) is widely used in advanced undergraduate, and graduate, classes.
